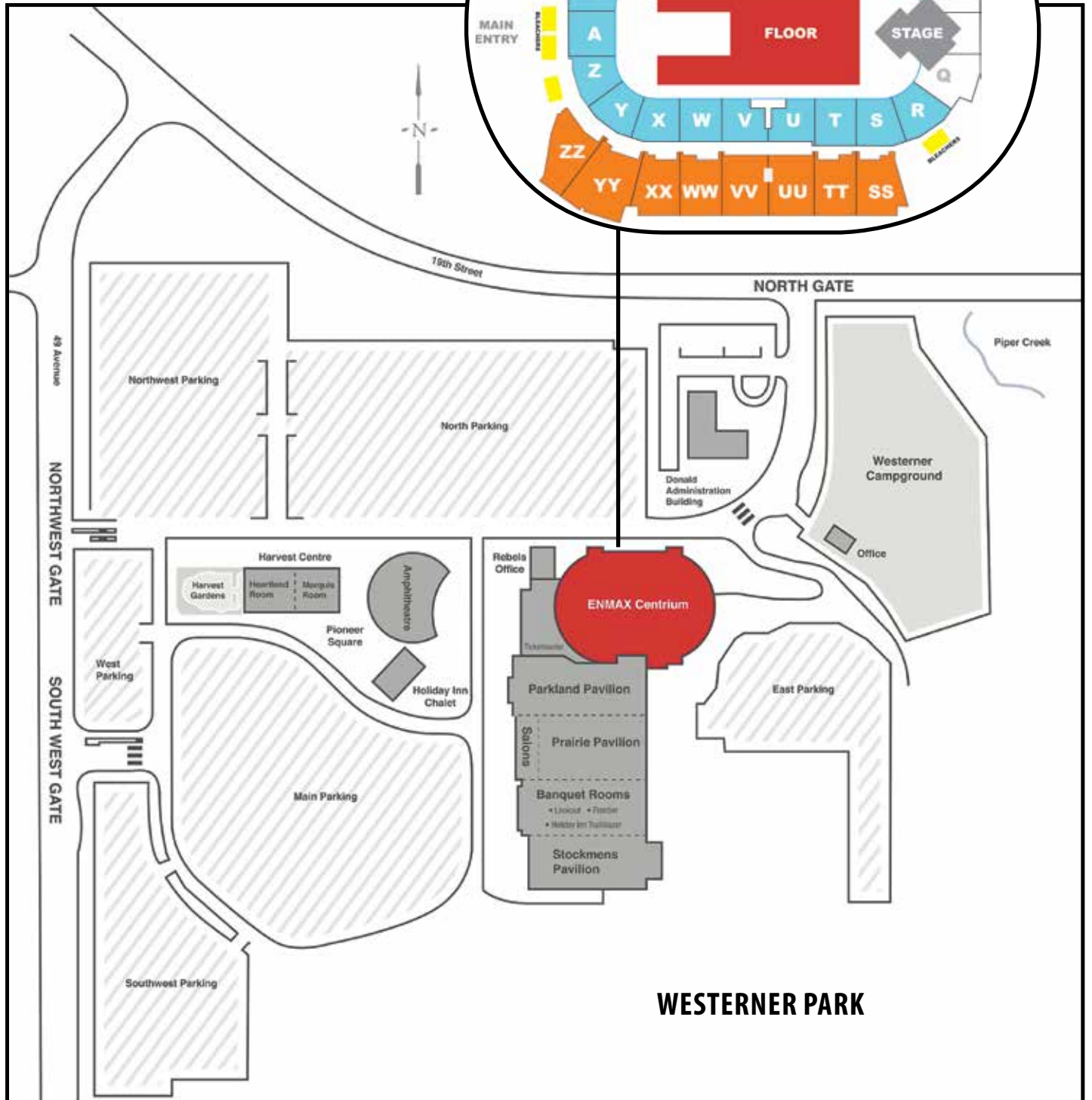

YC GENERAL INFORMATION & GUIDELINES

MAIN SESSIONS & WORKSHOPS

Main sessions are mandatory – they are the main reason for coming to YC. If you need to miss a main session, contact your youth leader before you leave. Being men and women of God, please be attentive during all sessions to hear the voice of God and allow others to do the same!

WRISTBANDS & TICKETS

There are three types of wristbands depending on the location of your seats. If you have purchased seats on the floor, your wristbands will be red. If you have purchased seats in the 100's (lower bowl), your wristbands will be blue. If you have purchased seats in the 200's (upper bowl) your wristbands will be orange.

Your wristband must be on your wrist for the entire weekend to gain access to YC Alberta. Wristbands should not be removed. Lost or broken wristbands may be replaced at the discretion of the YC Registrar and a \$10 replacement fee (if you still have the broken wristband and your proof of electronic ticket) or the \$199 event registration fee (if you lose the wristband and your proof of electronic ticket) may apply. Please visit the onsite registration office for assistance.

CONCERT & SESSION VOLUME LEVELS

Main session worship and concerts and side stage concerts may have volume levels that exceed 100 dB. We recommend that individuals or groups who find these volume levels uncomfortable or have concerns about exposure to loud volumes bring appropriate hearing protection with them.

EVENT SECURITY

For security purposes, Westerner Park reserves the right to inspect and/or check all bags brought into the venues. To avoid delays and inconvenience, we ask that you only bring what you need into the Enmax Centrum. Bags that are not absolutely necessary (medical supplies, diaper bags...) should be left on your bus, or in your vehicle or hotel.

Bag check areas are provided as a convenience for our delegates. Westerner Park and Extreme Dream Ministries are not responsible for the loss, theft or damage to personal belongings at the event. Please protect your valuables!

Laser pointers are prohibited in all event venues and will be confiscated if brought to the event. Individuals who use laser pointers may lose their wristband and be denied admission.

Westerner Park reserves the right to search individuals attending the event.

FIRST AID

The YC First Aid team is available to handle medical emergencies at the event. YC First Aid team members can be identified by their First Aid YC shirts and their identification tags. A "Sick-bay" is not available. Groups will need to make their own arrangements for individuals who need rest or extended medical care.



FOOD

Westerner Park does not allow BBQing in the parking lot, however bagged lunches are permitted inside the venue. Concessions & Food Trucks will be available throughout the event. Remember, these are professional sport arena concessions. Please expect professional sport arena prices.

ARTIST SIGNINGS

Certain artists may choose to greet delegates and sign autographs after their concerts. Artist signings will take place in the Parkland Pavilion. Please remember signings are at the discretion of the artist, time-limited, and may not occur even if scheduled.

CAMERAS, RECORDINGS

Contractual and copyright restrictions prevent the recording of concerts and musical portions of sessions at YC. Westerner Park and Extreme Dream Ministries are obligated to enforce these policies.

Still picture and video cameras may be allowed into the venues for you to record your group's YC experience, but will be confiscated for the duration of the event if they are used to record any portion of a concert or other musical performance.

No large format/professional style still and video cameras will be allowed into the venues.

LEADERS' LOUNGE

If you are a Youth Leader, please visit our Leaders' Lounge in the lookout room to sign up for access.

OTHER INFORMATION

YC Alberta is an event designed for youth in junior and senior high and for young adults. YC Alberta is monitored for safety and security purposes and to ensure compliance with event and venue policies. Our staff and volunteers do not chaperone or supervise delegates. Youth leaders, pastors, churches, and parents who register themselves, their children, other youth and other leaders are responsible for the supervision and care of everyone they have registered for the event. YC Alberta is a private event and Extreme Dream Ministries reserves the right to deny admission to individuals and/or groups at its sole discretion.

DISTRIBUTION OF MATERIALS

Individuals and organizations may not distribute promotional materials including flyers, brochures, gifts/giveaways, etc. without the express and prior approval of Extreme Dream Ministries. Anyone contravening this policy will be denied admission to the event.

YC ALBERTA PARKING

- Westerner Park offers up to 4,000 convenient, paved parking spaces in six main lots for your group to park in.
- Multi-day passes are available for weekend events lasting longer than one day, at a reduced rate. This pass allows one vehicle to enter the grounds as often as necessary without further payment. The pass must be presented at the gate upon every entry. Weekend passes can be purchased from the Donald Administration Building during regular business hours, or at the gates during paid parking hours. These passes are non-refundable. The prices are: 3 days - \$12.00; 2 days - \$8.00.
- Oversized units will be charged according to the number of stalls they require.
- Bus Parking will be located in the Northwest Parking Lot.



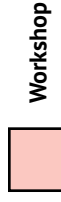

Leaders working with youth everyday, whether they are parents, teachers, and church youth leaders need to attend this workshop.

They will learn the average age of entry into the sex trade is 12 to 14 years of age. They need to know traffickers earn between \$260,000-\$280,000 per victim per year. They will learn how human traffickers lure our youth, and what they can do to recognize the signs and stop this from happening.

Joy Smith is Canada's leading advocate to combat human trafficking. She passed the laws in Parliament and has worked for 24 years to combat human trafficking in Canada.

BANDS & ARTISTS



AARON BOYD

Aaron Boyd's heart is to see people trained and released in their giftings. He does that by mentoring and encouraging others that he does life with at home, and also leading worship and creative team workshops as he travels. In turn he is encouraged and inspired to continue worshipping and creating music that both glorifies God and pushes the boundaries of what is and can be worship music.

AARON COLE

Aaron Cole currently resides and was born in Bristol, VA, a small American town that rests on the border between Tennessee and Virginia. Much like his home town connects two neighboring states, Cole seamlessly bridges the gap between rapping and singing. Releasing a total of six independent projects since the age of four, the 20-year-old has shared the stage with rappers KB, Social Club and Tye Tribbett to name a few. His musical influences include the soulful melodies of Stevie Wonder, the versatility of Mali Music and the grooves and lyricism of Jon Bellion. His talents have also been heard on tracks from Hollyn and Da Truth. In 2016 he was inducted into Christian Hip Hop's top media outlet, Rapizilla's Freshman Class and noted by Essence Magazine as one of 16 gospel artist to watch. His latest project, a six-track EP titled If I Can Be Honest was released in 2016 and features appearances by Derek Minor, Alic Walls (of The Walls Group), and Kaleb Mitchell.



FOR KING & COUNTRY

Soaring melodies, driving rhythms, theatrical instrumentation and personal themes are the heartbeat of for KING & COUNTRY. The Australian duo, comprised of brothers Joel and Luke Smallbone, raised expectations with the release of 2012's *Crave*, winning Billboard's New Artists to Watch for 2012. Their sophomore effort *RUN WILD. LIVE FREE. LOVE STRONG.* debuted at #1 on the iTunes Chart and garnered two Grammy Award wins for the band. They received yet another Grammy nomination in 2017 for their song "Priceless," the title track from their #1 indie film of the same name. This past Spring (2016), for KING & COUNTRY headlined a major 60-city arena tour, and finished the year with their first, headlining Christmas tour, selling out several arenas across the country, including the Honda Center in Los Angeles.

With over 150 shows in 2016, the band played for 1 million fans, has sold over 600,000 records and had 150,000,000 streams of their music. They have performed on numerous network television shows including *The View*, *Jimmy Kimmel Live!*, *The Today Show*, *The Tonight Show*, *FOX and Friends* and have songs featured on the Emmys, *The Super Bowl*, *Sunday Night Football*, *U.S. Open*, *7UP* and more.



MANAFEST

Manafest is a barrier breaking singer, songwriter, rapper, author and skater. He effortlessly merges rock, rap and pop throughout his music, carefully assembling experiences and compelling inspirations that speak to a wide variety of fans across the globe. His unique style has garnered him notable achievements such as four JUNO nominations, multiple GMA Dove nominations and a slew of GMA Canada Covenant awards. His music has been featured in the NFL, video

games, throughout television shows such as *Knight Rider*, *One Tree Hill* and *MTV Unplugged*, and most recently in the movie *Hard Target 2*. His intelligent and contagious music has sold over 300,000 albums worldwide and has brought him to perform over 1,000 shows across 4 continents.

MANIC DRIVE

Hailing from Toronto Canada, Manic Drive has been known for their energetic live show and infectious pop-rock anthems. Since their #1 smash hit "VIP" took over air-waves in 2014, their list of achievements continue with winning a Juno Award (Canada's most prestigious music award), topping Billboard's Christian Radio Charts, and an impressive touring career with some of Christian Music's most popular artists.

Manic Drive's recent album "Into the Wild" has already received notable success with their debut single "Easier" racing to #4 on the Billboard Christian Hot AC chart. Shortly following their radio success, Manic Drive released their online viral hit "Mic Drop". Within weeks, both songs accumulated millions of views and streams online. In the fall of 2019, this album was also recognized by the Juno Awards, and was nominated for "Best Christian/Gospel Album of the Year".

When asked to define the meaning behind emotive songs such as "Easier", vocalist of Manic Drive, Shawn Cavallo, explains how the song beautifully expresses the hardships of their Christian walk through life, and the desperate need of surrender. With rawness and authenticity that give listeners the chills when the lead vocalists cries out "it doesn't get easier, so show me how to get stronger".

Manic Drive has just completed their three month arena tour with Newsboys, Rend Collective, Ledger, Mandisa, Danny Gokey, and Hollyn on 2019's Winter Jam Tour Spectacular. They'll be continuing their momentum performing at major events and Christian festivals throughout the remainder of this year as they also prepare for new music on the horizon.



BANDS & ARTISTS

THE VOYAGE

The Voyage was formed in 2016 when Ryan Wegner, a Worship Pastor in Edmonton, Alberta, challenged a group of local artists to create an album with one goal in mind: to write songs about real life, faith, and God that were honest, heartfelt, and hopeful.



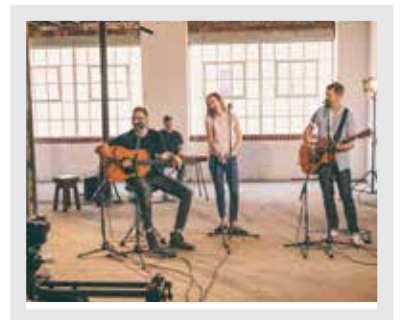
On February 22, 2018, The Voyage released their debut self-titled album. This collection of songs has inspired many people who have suffered from fear, pain and loss-instilling peace and hope to those inside and outside the church. Many of the songs have also become anthems of hope for their home church, Hope City Church (formerly Mill Woods Assembly) in Edmonton, Alberta.

Since their album release, The Voyage have been travelling throughout Western Canada leading worship, headlining concerts, and talking about their own journey with mental health and the healing and hope found in Jesus. They were nominated for four 2019 GMA Covenant Awards: Group of the Year, New Artist of the Year, Inspirational Album of the Year, and Praise and Worship Album of the Year.

This is the beginning of their journey – a family of artists searching for peace - searching for beauty - searching for God in the real world.

WORSHIP CENTRAL

Founded in 2006, Worship Central is a collective of worshippers who want to see the worship of Jesus made central throughout communities, local churches and the world. Based in Birmingham, UK, with local hub networks in 18 countries, Worship Central has trained, resourced and inspired worshippers from around the world. Thousands have attended training events internationally and engaged with the variety of resources created by the Worship Central team. They have released seven albums to date and written songs such as Spirit Break Out, The Way, Let It Be Known and Stir A Passion.



TIM & THE GLORY BOYS

Tim & the Glory Boys are independent recording artists based out of Abbotsford, British Columbia, Canada. Lead singer, Tim Neufeld, first achieved success as the co-founder and lead singer of EMI recording artist STARFIELD. Tim has toured the world for over a decade, shared the stage with countless Canadian Country, Roots and Christian artists, and won multiple Junos, Dove, and Covenant awards. The Glory Boys are a Canadian Bluegrass Trio of Lord Lovin' Hillbillies with world-class facial hair and infectious on-stage energy.

September 2014 saw the guys release their freshman album 'THE JOY', which went on to earn a JUNO nomination for Gospel Album of the year. Their next album 'HOOTENANNY!' was released in 2016 and won the 2017 JUNO award for Contemporary Christian/Gospel Album of the Year and featured the extremely popular track "Overhead Projector". The guys added to their 2017 trophy case by picking up two Covenant awards for 'Group of the Year' and 'Artist of the Year'. To date, the group have sold over 35,000 records and their songs have been streamed over 6.5 million times.

SPEAKERS

JOY SMITH

Joy Smith B.Ed, M.Ed, was a teacher for 23 years, a Member of the Manitoba legislature from 1999-2003, and a Member of Parliament from 2004-2015.

She first became aware of human trafficking from her police officer son, Edward, who was working in the Integrated Child Exploitation Unit (ICE). Joy Smith's faith caused her to answer the call of God on her life regarding this injustice. Over the years she has helped many young victims who have been exploited or trafficked by their abusers.

In Parliament, Joy Smith made Canadian history as the first sitting MP to amend the Criminal Code twice, passing Bill C-268, mandatory minimum sentencing for trafficking of children 18 years and younger, and Bill C-310, which reaches Canadian law into other countries where Canadian citizens or permanent residents traffic or exploit others abroad. These laws provide an incentive for survivors to testify against their abusers, knowing their perpetrators will be brought to justice under Canadian law. In addition, Joy Smith wrote the prototype for the National Action Plan to Combat Human Trafficking here in Canada. Joy Smith also took a leadership role in Bill C-36, making the purchase of sex illegal in Canada today and reducing the demand for human trafficking.

Joy Smith is known as a leading advocate against human trafficking worldwide, and a champion of women's rights. She has received many awards, including The Woman of Distinction Award, the Wilberforce Award, The United Nations Recognition of Achievement Award, the My Canada Hero Award, the Winnipeg Police Commendation Award, and the Citizen of the Year Award.

In 2011, she founded the "Joy Smith Foundation", where she tirelessly volunteers her time combatting human trafficking, and fighting for the rights of women in Canada and around the globe. The Joy Smith Foundation is a registered charity which seeks to end human trafficking in Canada, by raising awareness through education, and by providing funds to frontline organizations that rescue and rehabilitate victims of this heinous crime.

KAYLA JOY

From pastoral ministry to community networking, from junior high classrooms to leadership development, Kayla has spent well over a decade passionately investing in the next generation. Former Director of Next Gen Ministries for the Pentecostal Assemblies of Newfoundland & Labrador, now residing in Edmonton, she splits her time between teaching middle school in the Parkland School District, and serving as a member of the team at Evangel Church, specializing in next gen ministries and leadership development.

MATT JOY

After spending 15 years of pastoring on the East Coast, Matt and his family moved to Edmonton this past summer and he now serves with the team at Evangel Assembly as an Associate Pastor. Matt also serves as a member of the Canadian Armed Forces as a Padre for the 41 Combat Engineer Regiment out of Edmonton and Calgary. He is passionate about people and seeing the love of God and good news of the gospel change lives, families, and neighbourhoods. He is a big sports fan, loves spending time with others, and has lived to tell the story of how he fell out of a tree.



PAUL FRASER

Paul is currently serving as the National Church Multiplication Coordinator for the Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada. He lives in Edmonton with his family and has had over 20 years' experience working with students and their leaders. His passion is simple, to see as many people come to Jesus as possible!

PRESTON CENTUOLO

As a young boy Preston was invited to church by a deacon that promised him jello if he would go. This small effort made a great difference in the life of a young boy that God would eventually call into the ministry.

After graduating from Valley Forge Christian College, he intensified his ministry to teens through the local church becoming a successful youth pastor serving churches in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

Preston founded South Jersey Youth Alliance in 2000 in order to continue to expand ministry to his community and surrounding communities in South Jersey. Preston's evangelistic heart and love for people have made it possible for him to be used of God to bring the gospel of hope to teens and adults around the United States.

REGGIE DABBS

Born to an unwed teenager, Reggie Dabbs considers himself fortunate to be alive. With no place to go, the pregnant teenager ended up living in a chicken coop in Louisiana. It was there she remembered a former school teacher, Mrs. Dabbs, who had said to her students, "If you ever need anything, call me," and gave the students her home phone number. The girl called.

Mrs. Dabbs went to Louisiana, picked up the girl, and took her back to Tennessee where she and her husband, whose six children were adults by this time, took the girl into their home and cared for her until after the baby was born. They officially adopted him and gave him the Dabbs name. They instilled in him strong moral values, for which he is genuinely grateful.

Reggie talks to the kids in a humorous style about choices each of them has when faced with drugs, alcohol, suicide, etc. Reggie gets in kids faces and tells them that he never smoked a cigarette, never did drugs, never drank alcohol, because he chose not to. He assures them that they can make the same kinds of choices.

Reggie talks to kids about family and how thankful they should be that they have families. He talks to them about dating relationships and emphasizes that virginity is the most honorable choice. Most of all, Reggie drives home the fact that "You can never change your past, but you can change your future!"

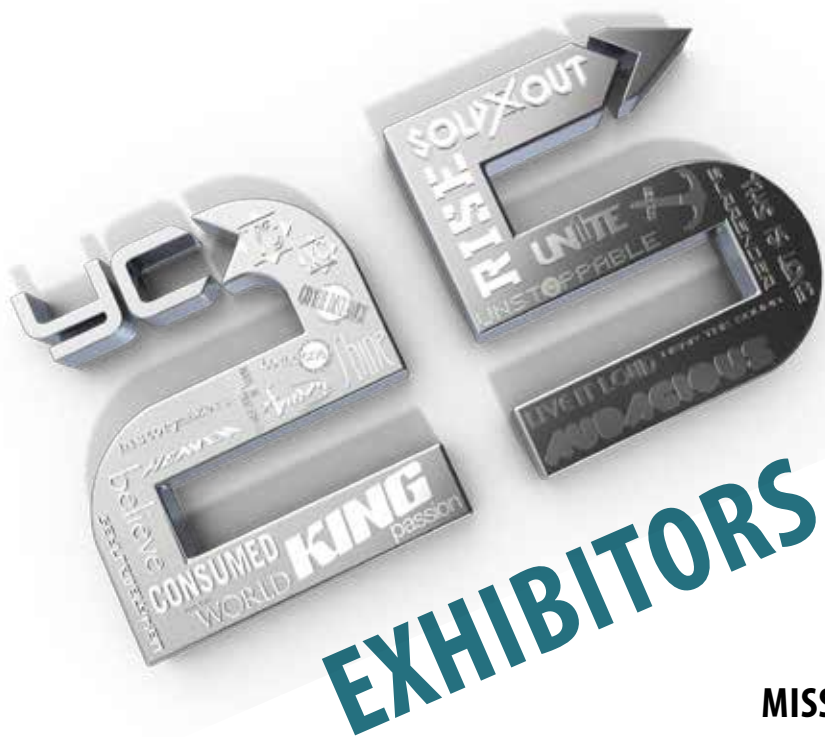
